In LEAD's second year, the team has continued to increase the positive perception of Lake County through each strategic initiative.

Business Creation celebrated the one-year anniversary of the Lake/Eustis Chapter of Kauffman's 1 Million Cups Chapter (Eustis) to represent all of Lake County's entrepreneurial efforts with 740 unique visitors and 50 unique presenters. In addition, several classes for the Kauffman FastTrac ® Program we held throughout the County. The LEAD team continues to partner with Lake County Government's Economic Development staff, the University of Central Florida's Business Incubation Program, State Small Business Development Center and several other key educational institutions with entrepreneurial efforts. The Small Business Database through StartUp Space has been implemented in 2024, which showcasing programming and provides an opportunity for businesses to interact through the platform.

Business Retention and Expansion efforts resulted in approximately 77 business visits in 2024 and 51 direct assists. As a result of these visits, many connections were made to area networks for continued business engagement. These referrals include, CareerSource Central Florida, FloridaMakes, Manufacturing Association of Central Florida, Lake-Sumter State College, Lake Tech and several other organizations. Additionally, the LEAD team, along with the Lake County Economic Development team, facilitated a displaced workforce day to assist those employees who were laid off from the Cultrale Plant Closure. The team is actively working to identify a new business opportunity for this facility.

Additionally, the team has stood conducted 11 industry councils. The intent of these councils is for continued interaction and solutions-based conversations relative to workforce development. The team partners with educational institutions throughout Lake County, as well as the Lake County Government Economic Development staff.

Business Attraction efforts focused on site development opportunities in 2024. LEAD continued to move the Strategic Sites Readiness information, provided by The State of Florida along with Duke Energy funding, forward to the next level. LEAD, along with the City of Minneola and Lake County assisted on a Florida Job Growth Grant Fund Application for the Minneola Hills industrial development project that would create over 2 million square feet in industrial space in the County for attraction efforts. The team hosted several promising site visits with both domestic and international clients. The current LEAD pipeline of leads and projects is strong, with over 14 active opportunities. In addition, the team continues to promote the Christopher C. Ford Commerce park's latest developments with nearly 2 million square feet of available speculative development, the Wellness Way Development, Minneola Hills Industrial Development and Wolf Branch Innovation District.
